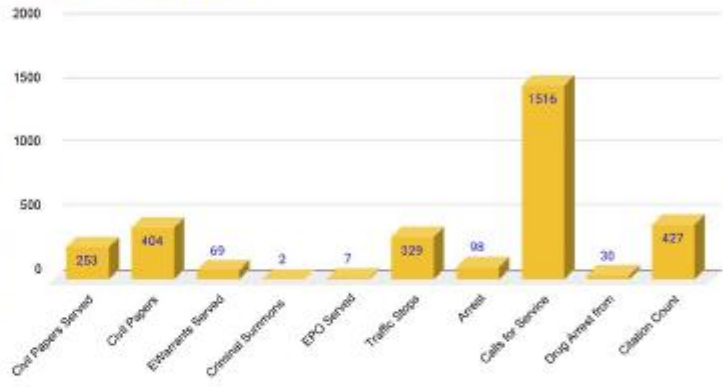

We are working on building the background for the new CAD 10-8 Systems. The process is going smoothly at this time.

Will be upgrading new computer equipment in the next few weeks. This upgrade is being paid for with 2025 Grant through the Kentucky 911 Services Board.

Recognition:

Nelson County E-911 Dispatch recently received their Project 33 APCO Agency Training Program Accreditation. Shanna excepted the award on the agency's behalf at the APCO National Conference in Baltimore. We are the first agency in the state to achieve this accreditation.

Daylon Walter and Hali Krebs have been promoted to shift leaders. Both will be attending classes geared towards leadership, people skills and operations. Over the next 6 months they will be trained by Shanna and myself on shift operations and daily responsibilities.
